



## Fly Fishing Report June 1, 2010

### FLY SHOP SPECIAL!

**These items won't last long so come on in and check it out.**

**Upper Savage:** 100 cfs Green drakes are hatching strong on the upper savage along with march browns, caddis, sulphurs, and midges. Flows are great for this time of year.

**Lower Savage:** 130 cfs: The lower river is at running at a pretty good level. Terrestrial fishing is getting pretty good. Try fishing black ants and beetles under the tree branches.

**Upper North Branch(Potomac)** 230cfs (Kitzmiller). The Upper North Branch is still a bit high, but is on the way down. Try fishing bead head nymphs, big stonefly nymphs, and wooly buggers deep in the pools to get into the action.

**Lower North Branch (Potomac):** 350cfs The lower north branch has a pretty solid flow. You can wade it, but be very careful, this is not an easy level to fish unless you're floating it in a boat. Throw weighted nymphs with indicators and watch for subtle takes. March browns are the dominant hatch now, but I've been seeing green drakes on float trips. Stimulators or parachute adams with nymph droppers are producing in the evenings.

**Casselman:** 100 cfs. The Casselman is fishing great right now. Flows are perfect. We've been having great dry fly action just about every day. Caddis are dominating the action, but march browns are still hanging on strong along with some stoneflies and a few slate drakes. I've been seeing some pretty good sulphur hatches the last week or so too. Wooly buggers and big stonefly nymphs are also producing some larger fish.

**The Yough:** 260 cfs (Oakland) The flows are finally dropping to a good level for wading. Green drakes are strong right now, but will disappear soon. Caddis are coming off daily with some stoneflies and a few march browns. We're starting to see #12 sulphurs starting to come off too.
