



Covid-19 Lift Operations Guidelines

Overall, we commit to:

- Follow CDC guidelines to reduce the transmission of COVID-19.
- Continue monitoring the latest policies, procedures, and practices, operating in compliance with masks, physical distancing, or other requirements as established by state and local authorities.
- Follow protocols to clean and disinfect the facility to safeguard employees and guests from COVID-19.
- In addition to any government guidelines, follow precautions of manufacturers such as Wiegand and Doppelmayr.
- Provide signage visible to guests and employees addressing recommendations to “Stop the Spread”.

Employee Safety and Protocols:

- Educate on symptoms of COVID-19 and related illness policies, emphasizing the need for symptomatic or exposed employees to report circumstances and self-quarantine.
- Implement proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette as well as provide employees the proper PPE as needed.
- Require employees to wear proper PPE. All employees must wear mask when indoors and outdoors as well when consistent physical distancing of 6 feet is not possible.
- Increase physical space between workers at the worksite IE: lift control buildings and loading areas.
- Enhanced training on Personal Protective Equipment and Safety Data Sheets to ensure all employees can safely use provided supplies effectively in compliance with CDC standards - differentiate between cleaning and sanitizing.
- Ensure physical distancing and maintain appropriate cleanliness in break areas, service entrance doors, and lift control buildings.
- Disinfect workspace prior to a different employee or shift taking over IE: workstation and equipment.
- Regular use electrostatic sprayer to disinfect employee and public areas.

At lift stations:

- All lift employees shall wear face coverings and strive to maintain 6-foot physical distancing.
- All guests will be required to wear face coverings; while waiting in lift lines, loading, unloading, and riding chairlifts.
- No one will be allowed on the mountain without a face covering.
- Face coverings are not required on guests during the physical act of skiing or snowboarding if proper physical distancing is maintained but do need to be worn at the lift loading and unloading areas and while riding the lift.
- Lift line corrals and mazes will be set up with spacing between the typical lane configuration with makes an empty “ghost lane” which will maintain physical distancing within the width of the maze. Guests will maintain physical distancing throughout the length of the line because of the length of the skis and snowboards.
- Use of touch free trash cans at the stations.
- Post mask and physical distancing signage as needed at the lift entrance and maze areas.
- “Travel together, ride together” guidelines will be followed for chairlift loading as well as pairing singles that are comfortable riding together with masks on opposite ends of the chair.
- Singles not comfortable riding with another single will load solo on triple chairs and sit in the middle of the chair. On Quad chairlifts two unrelated singles will be loaded on the same chair but at opposite ends of the chair.
- All children age 3 and up are required to wear a face covering in accordance with the CDC guidelines

Ski & Snowboard School Lessons:

- Guests load chairlifts with family and friends they are comfortable riding with during the lesson.
- Instructors may choose to ride chairlifts with one guest separated by the middle seat(s) if both parties are comfortable doing so.
- If a parent or guardian is not comfortable with a younger person potentially riding the chairlift solo, they may tag along to ride the chairlift with the child. If a parent or guardian is not available to ride the chairlift with a child that is not comfortable riding alone, the child will be placed in a lesson that will only use the conveyor lifts.

Our goal is to be completely transparent and educate our employees and guests regarding the guidelines. It is the responsibility and an expectation that everyone will follow the guidelines. If not, the employee or guest will be reminded of the guideline and anyone not willing to comply will lose area use privileges.
